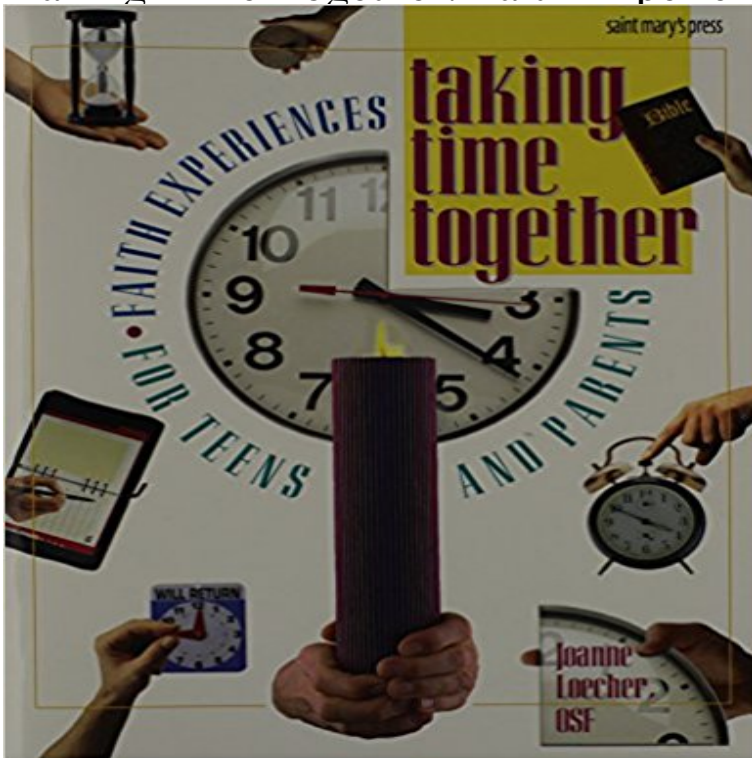


## Taking Time Together: Faith Experiences for Teens and Parents
